The NICE Properties of Auxiliaries

- Auxiliaries are subject-raising verbs (following Ross) • Most basic distributional facts about them can be handled through ARG-ST constraints -- that is selectional restrictions between auxiliaries and their complements (following McCawley) • Auxiliaries are identified via a HEAD feature AUX, which we have not yet put to use

English Grammar - Questions Asking questions 1 The basic rule for asking questions in English is straightforward: Invert the order of the subject and the first auxiliary verb It is snowing = Is it snowing? He can speak German = Can he speak German? They have lived here a long time = Have they lived here a long time?
